Session info

THE CITY OF HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ

In the medieval ages, the city was the traditional dowry of Czech Queens. Hradec Králové is famous for its urbanism and the architecture of the early 20th century – you will be able to see two of its highlights yourselves!

Hradec Králové is also a traditional rival of the nearby city Pardubice (where the other Czech RSC accidentally takes place). People from Pardubice often call Hradec the Moss-town. Why, you ask? One version of the legend tells us that scientists from a local university used to plant huge amounts of moss because of an ambitious research project – which did not turn out to be successful.

THE SESSION MOTTO

"Challenging the Concept of Culture"

We took a long and arduous journey to come up with our session motto but we believe it's one we can be very happy about. Hradec Králové is a very cultural city, it hosts many festivals and has a rich cultural life, so we wanted to have a session motto reflecting that. But the session motto reflects that culture is not just going to the theatre, it's not just that set of things that make up a nation/country/group of people who live in one spot and have similar upbringings. There is much more to culture - education, social systems, food, drink, literature, jokes, rules of behaviour... Culture is pretty much everything that helps us being social and we wanted to make sure everyone at the session thinks about their own culture and how different it might be from someone else's... and how very similar they actually are in many ways, a thing one needs to be constantly reminded of in contemporary Europe.

ABOUT THE SESSION

There is a first time for everything and RSCs are not different to that. The preparation of the whole concept began 2 years ago and the preparation for the session itself started in January 2016. It is a new concept for EYP CZ. The sessions will be twins, Hradec Králové and Pardubice (alphabetically, but in temporal order it would be reversed), both three days long and each providing space for about 80 Delegates and roughly 150 participants in total. Most of the Delegates will be first-timers and it is they who we try to hook in and get interested in EYP.

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HOW TO PLAN YOUR TRAVEL

All Delegates should arrive before 12:00 on 9 December. It is crucial for us to start with the programme on time. Since it takes approximately 20 minutes to get from the train/bus station to the hotel, we advise you to plan your travel with a time reserve (meaning you should not arrive to the station at 11:55 unless you come from great distance and you have no other travel option).

FIRST DAY

When you arrive to the accommodation, there is going to be a check-in. You are also going to get a lunch box. At 12:30 everybody is going to move to Gymnázium J.K.Tyla for the Teambuilding. Teachers are going to have separate programme during that time. In the evening, everybody is going to gather at the Opening Ceremony. After that the Global Village is going to take place (every delegation is going to have a country for food assigned) and it is also going to serve as a dinner. That means you should encourage your students to bring the best food they can.

EVENTS

OPENING CEREMONY

The official initiation of the whole session packed with remarkable speeches from people who are somehow part of the session (the President, Head Organisers etc.) or are indispensable for it.

GLOBAL VILLAGE

The Global Village gives the Delegates a unique opportunity to share and taste typical food and beverages from various countries all over the globe. Every delegation is required to prepare a little degustation of cuisine of their allocated country. But you are strongly encouraged to bring other items, such as souvenirs, traditional dresses, flags or anything connected to the country and its culture. Please be aware that there is no dinner on Friday, so bring enough food to feed all the participants. Also, please take into account that only alcoholic beverages with less than 15% of alcohol are allowed.

Dress Code - Smart Casual / Business Formal (directly after Opening Ceremony) or Traditional Costumes

TEAMBUILDING

Teambuilding is essential for the Delegates because they to get to know each other and their chairpersons through fun games, energisers and challenging tasks. They connect and form a functional team. This will help them later on during Committee Work, because only teamwork leads to a good atmosphere and therefore to an easier way to create a great resolution.

Dress Code - Casual (comfortable clothes)

COMMITTEE WORK

The heart of every session. During Committee Work, current topics affecting each and every one of us are discussed and compromises are reached during tough negotiations. The outcome is a final resolution, which is later presented to other committees in the time of General Assembly.

PARTY

It cannot be only about the work. Our Delegates need time to relax and loosen up a little bit. And a party is the perfect way to do it. This years' theme is Make your own superhero! Please encourage your students to get as creative as possible with their costumes because there are no limits and endless fun is guaranteed.

The General Assembly gives all Delegates the opportunity to summarize and defend their resolutions, engage in heated discussions, share their ideas and opinions and have the ultimate power to decide, which resolutions are bulletproof and elaborated enough to pass.

VENUES



HOSTEL ACADEMIC

Our shelter, which will protect us from the chilly nights. Not only will it provide us with cosy beds, you will also find WiFi and a small café in there. It is conveniently located, within a short walk from the city centre.



GYMNÁZIUM J. K. TYLA

This beautiful building is going to provide us with its facilities during the Teambuilding and Committee Work. Moreover, we will enjoy most of our meals in its cafeteria. It is the seat of a high school, which claims its origins back to the fourteenth century. The building itself was designed by a famous Czech architect, Josef Gočár, as a masterpiece of the early constructivism. Note also the sculpture on the column – Vítěz (The Winner) by Jan Štursa. From the interesting personalities, who have attended this school, you might know Karel Čapek.

DIVADLO DRAK

The Opening Ceremony and the consequent Global Village will take place in this curious venue. Welcome to a Puppet Theatre! Mainly fairy-tale productions have been performed here so far, some of them influencing the world puppets' scene (such as "Šípková Růženka" - The Sleeping Beauty, "Popelka" - Cinderella, or "Pinokio" - Pinocchio).



MUZEUM VÝCHODNÍCH ČECH V HRADCI KRÁLOVÉ

This Art Nouveau museum building was designed by another significant architect of the early 20th century, Jan Kotěra. When inside, have a look and note that its structure reminds of medieval temples; it forms a latin cross, the navel being even ended by a presbytery and crowned by a cupola. We are excited to have our General Assembly in this impressive building!

TEACHERS' ACCOMMODATION

Teachers will be accommodated in a hotel near the city centre. Detailed information will be provided before the session, depending on the number of teachers participating. The hotel will provide you with breakfast, other meals will be provided by us.

TRAVEL GUIDE

FROM PRAGUE TO HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ

There are two options how to get from Prague to Hradec Králové.

BY TRAIN

By train that departs from Prague Main Train Station (it is at metro line C – station Hlavní nádraží)

BY BUS

By buses that depart either from Florenc Central Bus Station (which is at the intersection of metro line B and C – station Florenc) or from Černý most, which is a final station of metro line B.

For the specific coach or train c(z)ech out the following website: http://jizdnira-dy.idnes.cz/vlakyautobusy/spojeni/, which also has an English version. Keep in mind that you are supposed to be in Hradec Králové at 12:00 CET on 9 December!

SPECIFIC SUGGESTIONS

- 9.15 Bus departing from Černý most station; will be in Hradec Králové at 10:30
- **10.00** Bus departing from **Florenc** station (platform 7); will be in Hradec Králové at 11:35
- **10.00** Another bus departing from **Florenc** station (platform 24); will be in Hradec Králové at 11:40
- 10.00 A train departing from Hlavní nádraží; will be in Hradec Králové at 11:51

FROM BRNO TO HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ

THERE IS ONLY ONE DIRECT BUS FROM BRNO TO HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ THAT MORNING:

7.40 Bus departing from Zvonařka station- will be in Hradec Králové at 10:35

BUT THERE ARE OTHER WAYS TO GET TO HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ:

- **8.36** A train departing from Brno central station, you have to get out of the train at 10:10 in Pardubice and change for another train, which leaves at 10:32; will be in Hradec Králové at 10:55
- **8.57** A train departing from Brno central station, you have to get out of the train at 10:54 in Pardubice and change for another train, which departs at 11:02; will be in Hradec Králové at 11:21

WITHIN HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ

In Hradec Králové a ticket for public transport costs 20 Kč. If we use public transport during the session, you will not need a ticket (we will take care of that :))

WE WILL BE THERE FOR YOU ONCE YOU GET TO HRADEC KRÁLOVÉ, BUT JUST SO YOU KNOW:

If you want to get from the Central Station (bus or train, they are just one station of public transport apart) to the accommodation, you have to take a bus number 1, 9 or 28 and get out at Heyrovského station or a bus number 16 or 24 and get out at Fakultní nemocnice B station.

WHAT IS EYP



The European Youth Parliament is a politically unbound non-profit organisation established in 1987. EYP involves 40 different countries as well as about 40 000 youth participants. It aims to promote active citizenship, international dialogue, involvement and understanding, and to bring together young people from all over Europe to develop their ability to work in a team, communication and organising skills, and also to form a lifelong friendships.

OUR EVENTS

Apart from Regional Selection Conferences and then the following National Selection Conference, EYP Czech Republic organizes other events, such as EYP Days at schools (for future Delegates to learn about the concept of the European Youth Parliament and to try Committee Work and General Assembly before applying for real sessions), annual meetings for its members, European Fora, the project Understanding Europe and last but not least, the upcoming International Session Brno 2017.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- There will be an Organiser waiting for you at the train/bus station, when you arrive. He/she will hold a transparent saying "EYP".
- **7** Please fill out the Travel Form so we know when and where you arrive.
- Please arrange your travel so you are at the accommodation at 12:00. The journey from the station to the accommodation takes approximately 20 minutes.
- Delegates will receive a lunch box at the check-in.
- Global Village on Friday evening is the dinner, so do not forget to bring the food. Also, many Delegates forget non-alcoholic drinks.
- Do not forget the appropriate clothes (formal for the GA), remind that to your students as well.
- 7 It is not possible to enter the committee rooms because it distracts the Delegates from work. There will be, however, organised shifts on Saturday afternoon.
- Even if you are from Hradec Králové, the Delegates must be accommodated in our session hostel.
- Please plan your departure after 17:00 on Sunday.
- We will provide you with food during the whole session (except for Friday evening the Global Village)
